## 1. NSW JOBTRAINER PROMOTIONAL RESOURCES FOR SKILLING FOR RECOVERY PRIORITY INDUSTRIES NOW AVAILABLE

Online engagement and awareness of the NSW JobTrainer program is strong, and the latest statistics are encouraging. For instance, between 14-20 May 2022, the Department's website drove 2,000 link clicks to Providers' websites. Also, there were 32,000 unique visits to the [NSW JobTrainer](#) landing page during this period.

To capitalise on this level of interest, providers are strongly encouraged to use their own channels to promote the NSW JobTrainer/Skilling for Recovery program for priority industries with extended eligibility:

- aged care;
- early childhood education and care (childcare);
- disability care;
- digital skills; and
- training and assessment qualifications (TAE).

To support this process, a range of consistent branded promotional collateral, such as social media tiles, recommended social media messages, banners and other visual and audio-visual material/resources, are now available for Providers to access for priority sectors on the [NSW Government](#) website.

Providers can use the tiles across a variety of social media channels, including Facebook, Twitter and Instagram, and/or include the promotional banners on their websites or newsletters.

New collateral will be released on the NSW Government website on a regular basis throughout 2022. We will continue to notify Providers as Smart and Skilled Updates and additional promotional material become available.

## 2. UPDATED SKILLING FOR RECOVERY - CONSTRUCTION PART QUALIFICATIONS – ELIGIBILITY FOR EXISTING WORKERS IN CONSTRUCTION

The Skilling for Recovery (SfR) - Construction part qualification student eligibility for the "Existing Worker in Construction" category has been updated.

The definition of eligibility has been changed from:

*An existing worker in Construction*

to:

*An employed person seeking to undertake training in **construction or related industries** and is one of the following:*

- *An existing worker i.e. a person currently employed in one of the construction or related industries;*
- *A person who is currently employed in another industry, looking to reskill to obtain employment in construction or a related industry.*

**Definition of Construction or related industries:** *includes building and construction, manufacturing, engineering, transport and logistics, electrotechnology, gas and utilities, deconstruction and asbestos removal, construction landscaping and warehousing.*

This new definition applies from, Tuesday 31 May 2022.

**Please note:**

1. The [Smart and Skilled Skilling For Recovery - Existing Worker in Construction Priority Part Qualifications List](#) still only applies for existing workers in the construction or related industries. These are, in the main, part qualifications that require industry experience (and includes those that require construction industry experience under legislation).
2. Priority part qualifications on the [Smart and Skilled Skilling For Recovery - Construction Jobseekers / Youth / Existing Workers \(not in construction\) Priority Part Qualifications List](#) can be accessed by eligible students who are new entrants to the industry, which includes existing workers from other industries seeking to reskill in the construction or related industries.
3. The definitions of who can access training from each of the Skilling for Recovery - Construction priority part qualifications lists will also be updated in the *Smart and Skilled Policy for the Skilling for Recovery Initiative* and the *Smart and Skilled Targeted Priorities Pre-Vocational and Part Qualifications Program – Skilling for Recovery – Construction Provider Fact Sheet* to reflect the eligibility changes.
4. Skilling for Recovery part qualifications flagged by exception will still require supporting evidence with TNI applications.

### 3. TRAINING SERVICES NSW – REBUILDING SKILLS STRATEGY – INTENT TO PARTICIPATE NOW OPEN

The Department is inviting Smart and Skilled Providers to register their intent to participate in delivering part qualifications for the Rebuilding Skills Strategy.

#### a. About the Rebuilding Skills Strategy

Under the strategy, funding will be available to Smart and Skilled Providers to deliver specific part qualifications which support the community recovery in seven declared disaster-affected local government areas (LGAs) associated with the major flood events of 2022:

LGA	Smart and Skilled Region
Ballina	Richmond-Tweed
Byron	Richmond-Tweed
Clarence Valley	Coffs Harbour-Grafton
Kyogle	Richmond-Tweed
Lismore	Richmond-Tweed
Richmond Valley	Richmond-Tweed
Tweed	Richmond-Tweed

#### b. Eligible part qualifications

The part qualifications eligible for funding under this strategy have been identified in consultation with industry and the community in the North Coast region and are listed on the [Intent to Participate form](#).

The eligible part-qualifications will evolve quickly to reflect the recovery effort in the affected regions. Where there is a need to update the eligible part-qualifications, the **Intent to Participate form** will be updated to allow Providers to make further submissions.

### i. Closing date and assessment process

There is **no closing date** on the **Intent to Participate form** to reflect the flexible nature of the strategy, however the program will be phased to reflect the region's needs.

Please see the Evaluation process section below for more information on the assessment process.

### c. Student Eligibility

Students must:

- meet Smart and Skilled eligibility; and
- also live or are working in the seven declared disaster-affected North Coast LGAs (see above). People living or working in the disaster-declared areas have priority access to training under this strategy.

For people coming into the region from outside of the disaster-declared areas to assist with the rebuild and who require training to complete work, evidence must be provided that demonstrates the need for out-of-region workers.

### d. Promotion

Part qualifications funded under this strategy will be included on Departmental websites promoting training in these sectors. Promotional material will also be made available to Providers.

### e. Register your intent to participate

If you are interested in delivering training under this strategy, please complete and submit the [Intent to Participate form](#) **ASAP** to enable the assessment process to begin.

### f. Evaluation process

Intent to participate requests will be assessed based on the demand for training in each area, so priorities will vary.

Requests will be initially assessed against:

- the Provider's past performance under Smart and Skilled;
- the Provider's performance in delivering Skilling for Recovery Priority Part Qualifications (including funding usage, i.e. enrolment and commencement rates);
- the Provider's approval status for high-risk work license part qualifications with SafeWork NSW, as relevant.

Requests will then be assessed by Training Services NSW - North Coast Regional Office against the demand for training in the seven disaster-declared LGAs to determine successful Providers and funding levels.

Training Services NSW's Regional Offices will contact successful Providers to negotiate TNIs and discuss under which part qualification program each TNI should be submitted.

#### **Please note:**

Given the extended eligibility for Skilling for Recovery, which the new definition for eligible Existing Workers in Construction (outlined in the first section of this update) allows, Providers will

be asked to submit TNIs for construction or related industries part qualifications under the Skilling for Recovery - Construction part qualifications program.

TNIs for all other part qualifications under this strategy will be submitted under either the Smart and Skilled Targeted Priorities Prevocational and Part Qualifications (TPPPQ) Program or the Skilling for Recovery - Redeployment and Youth Program.

The program under which the part qualification training will be funded will be dependent on student eligibility for either program and will be confirmed by the Regional Office during TNI discussions.

#### g. Target group for TNI applications

The following target group **must** be selected for TNI applications under this strategy, **regardless** of the part qualifications program under which the TNI is submitted:

Target group: ***Rebuilding Skills North Coast***

#### h. Enrolment and training delivery dates

TNI applications submitted under this strategy will **not** be accepted without consultation with a Training Services NSW Regional Office via the Intent to Participate evaluation process above.

Successful Providers can enrol students as soon as the relevant PAS is accepted by the Provider. **Phase One enrolments must occur no later than 31 July 2022, with a training delivery completion date of 30 September 2022.**

Training commencement periods of up to eight weeks can be negotiated with the relevant Training Services NSW Regional Office.

**Please note:** To support take-up of training, extensions to the above timeframes can be negotiated on a case by case basis.

#### i. Notification of Enrolment

When undertaking the Notification of Enrolment for funded Skilling for Recovery students to obtain a Commitment ID under this strategy, please ensure that you select the appropriate government strategy from the drop-down list to indicate which Skilling for Recovery student eligibility category the student meets .

#### j. Key dates

- **31 May 2022** –Intent to Participate form opens.
- **1 June 2022** – Training Services NSW Regional Offices will start contacting Providers who lodged an Intent to Participate request to discuss TNI applications. **This process will be ongoing.**
- **31 July 2022** – Phase One students must be enrolled by this date.
- **30 September 2022** – Phase One training delivery must be completed.

**Please note:**

Where Providers need more time to enrol students and/or complete training because of COVID-19 impacts, extensions can be sought from the relevant Training Services NSW Regional Office.

## 4. FINANCIAL CAP REVIEW 1 – 2022-23 ACTIVITY PERIOD

Financial Caps will be adjusted early in the 2022-23 Activity Period for the following:

- **Continuing students:**

Where commitments for continuing students have increased since March 2022 (when allocations were calculated by the Department) and the Department assesses that further allocations are required for continuing students for Smart and Skilled and/or Skilling for Recovery. **Providers do not need to request additional funding for continuing students, the Department will calculate any additional amounts and make offers to Providers.**

- **Skilling for Recovery - New commencements:**

To allocate Skilling for Recovery funding for additional new eligible students **enrolled up to 31 December 2022**. Enrolment take-up in 2021-22 will be an important factor when considering any additional allocations for new enrolments for 2022-23. Please see further details below.

Providers will be invited to participate in a Financial Cap Review for the 2022-23 Activity Period. This Financial Cap Review is for **Skilling for Recovery New Commencements** only, for the 2022-23 Activity Period.

## 5. RELEASE OF VERSION 4.0 OF THE SMART AND SKILLED POLICY ON NON-APPRENTICESHIP PATHWAYS FOR TRADE-RELATED QUALIFICATIONS (TRADE RELATED POLICY)

Version 4.0 of the *Smart and Skilled Policy on Non-Apprenticeship Pathways for Trade-Related Qualifications* (Trade Related Policy) has been released. The policy was introduced in 2016 and aims to support individuals who have trade/industry experience and would benefit from a trade qualification, but for whom an apprenticeship may not be appropriate.

The Policy relates to full qualification pathways in specific trade qualifications for students who:

1. meet the **Smart and Skilled Eligibility Criteria** (as outlined in the [Smart and Skilled Student Eligibility Policy](#)), and
2. are **over 21 years of age**, and
3. have at least **2 years of work experience** in the occupation/trade that relates to the qualification they will be undertaking (which should be equivalent to 20 per cent of Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) for the units of competency in the qualification), and
4. are currently working in the relevant industry – or have worked within the industry in **the past 5 years** – in a role that relates to the trade qualification they will be undertaking.

Students must meet the criteria set out above in order to be enrolled in a qualification covered by the Trade Related Policy via a full qualification pathway.

Version 4.0 of the Policy takes effect for all new enrolments (the day after this update is released) for training commencing on or after 1 July 2022.

**Note:** This Policy is separate to, and complements, the [Trade Pathways for Experienced Workers Program](#).

#### a. Qualifications covered by the Trade Related Policy

The qualifications covered by the Trade-Related Policy are listed in **Version 13.1** of the NSW Skills List and are marked with a “T” for Trade Related in the *Strategy* column on the [NSW Skills List](#).

These qualifications are funded through the Smart and Skilled Entitlement Full Qualification or the Targeted Priorities Full Qualification programs.

The 118 qualifications that are covered by the Policy are at **Appendix A**.

#### b. Qualifications not covered by the Trade Related Policy

Trade qualifications that are available under the Smart and Skilled Entitlement Full Qualification program or the Targeted Priorities Full Qualification program which are **not** marked with a “T” in the *Strategy* column on the NSW Skills List are:

- outside the scope of the Policy and therefore not subject to the same eligibility criteria in the Policy;
- may be delivered as a full qualification without prior approval from the Department.

For young people (i.e. under 21 years of age), apprenticeships remain the preferred pathway.

#### c. Changes to the policy

The key changes are:

- eligibility criteria are more clearly defined based on Departmental expectations of the level of work experience students enrolling in this initiative should have;
- clarification that students who enrol under this initiative should only do so if they have the relevant experience to translate into RPL (for a minimum of 20% of the units in the qualification);
- updates to the list of qualifications covered by this initiative.

#### d. Summary of changes to Version 4.0 of the Trade Related Policy

<b>Section 1.1</b>	Introduction	New paragraph explaining that the Trade Pathways for Experienced Workers Program (TPEW) operates outside of Smart and Skilled and therefore this Policy.

<b>Section 2.1</b>	Student Eligibility	Existing eligibility criteria previously dispersed throughout the Policy has been grouped into a new section, and the criteria tightened based on the Department's expectations of the level of work experience students enrolling in this initiative should have.
<b>Section 2.2</b>	Recognition of prior learning	Clarifies that a student should only be entered into a full qualification pathway if they have sufficient industry experience to be granted RPL for a minimum of 20 per cent of the units of competency in the qualification.
<b>Section 4.3</b>	Monitoring and documentation	New paragraph stating that where Providers do not adhere to the student eligibility and/or other requirements in the Policy, this may result in compliance action.

#### e. Monitoring and compliance

Please be advised the Department will be undertaking close monitoring of:

- compliance with student eligibility criteria (particularly that all enrolments are for students aged over 21 years);
- the balance of RPL and credit transfer that students are granted in relevant units of competency;
- the balance of a Provider's delivery between apprenticeship and full qualification pathways (i.e. look for trends in the change of delivery approaches).

## 6. ADVICE ON THE EXEMPTION TO THE STANDARDS FOR TRAINING PACKAGES – MEM RELEASE 2.0

In 2021, Skills Ministers across all jurisdictions agreed to the [Exemption to the Standards for Training Packages – MEM Release 2.0](#). The decision limited 14 trade qualifications in the MEM – Manufacturing and Engineering training package to delivery via workplace-based pathways (underpinned by an employment or training contract), with some exemption conditions.

Smart and Skilled Providers are advised that in NSW, non-apprentice workers may undertake training in one of the 14 MEM trade qualifications covered by this decision via a non-apprenticeship pathway provided that the Smart and Skilled Provider is satisfied that:

- the student meets the employment requirements (which is broader than apprenticeships only and may cover students employed in a workplace – including on a part-time or casual basis – that provides access to the opportunities/resources/equipment required to learn, demonstrate competency and be assessed in the trade qualification) or otherwise meets the relevant exceptions outlined in the decision; and



- and training and assessment is able to occur in a way that complies with the training package requirements.

**Note:** As outlined in version 4.0 of the Trade Related Policy, it is a Smart and Skilled Provider's obligation to ensure any training in MEM qualifications covered by the Skills Ministers' decision and the Trade Related Policy is compliant with both requirements.

## 7. NSW SKILLS LIST UPDATED – VERSION 13.1 RELEASED

The NSW Skills List has been updated. This update covers changes as a result of the release of version 4.0 of the Smart and Skilled policy on Non-Apprenticeship Pathways for Trade-Related Qualifications (Trade Related Policy)

## 8. WINTER SKILLS 2022 NOW OPEN

The Department's Winter Skills program is now open for 2022. Winter Skills is a JobTrainer initiative that seeks to address skills shortages being experienced across Winter tourism hot spots. The initiative focuses on Hospitality, Tourism and Accommodation skills across the State, targeting 16-24 year olds and job seekers. Normal JobTrainer/Skilling for Recovery eligibility conditions apply.

If you wish to be part of the Winter Skills program, please contact your Skills Broker to discuss. Training Needs Identification applications (TNIs) related to Winter Skills will not be considered unless they have been negotiated prior to submission with your local Skills Broker or Training Services NSW Regional Office.

The Department has launched a [Winter Skills website](#) that allows learners to search for part qualification courses by key words and filter them by region to find the training and locations which best meet their needs.

## 9. NEW PRICING FOR SKILLING FOR RECOVERY PRIORITY PART QUALIFICATIONS

The Department has applied a CPI increase of 3.1 per cent (%) to all qualification prices.

The CPI increase will apply to training that commences **on or after 1 July 2022** and these prices will be available in Version 7.0 of the Skilling for Recovery (SfR) Priority Part Qualification Lists for Redeployment & Youth and Construction, which can be found at: [nsw.gov.au/education-and-training/vocational/funding/nsw-skills-list](https://nsw.gov.au/education-and-training/vocational/funding/nsw-skills-list).

Additionally, a price increase to the **Certificate III in Electrotechnology Electrician (UEE30820)** has occurred. Consequently, the Unit of Competency (UoC) price has been adjusted for 22 UEE units. From 1 July 2022, the increased UoC prices will apply to Credit Transfer/Recognition of Prior Learning and part qualifications that relate to these units.
